SUBJECT: FOURTH QUARTER AND END OF 2003-2004 SCHOOL YEAR  
SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION REPORT

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. This information, as well as year-end summaries by school and category for each Instructional Division level for the 2003-2004 school year, is shown in the narrative information below and in Attachments A - L.

In accordance with the School Board's adopted goal to "Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools...", all efforts were focused to provide safe and healthy schools. This goal has been supported by the employees at each school, as well as by the students and their parents and the business and general community. Again this year, the Anchorage Police Department was extremely supportive in its assistance to the schools. The attached discipline/suspension reports from the elementary, middle, and high schools show the statistics for the fourth quarter and the recently completed school year and the schools' efforts to address this important goal.

**Fourth Quarter Expulsions**

Fourteen middle school students and 59 high school students were expelled by the School Board during the fourth quarter of 2003-2004, for a total of 73 students. Of the middle school students expelled, six were for fighting, one for assault of staff, one for firearms, two for weapons (BB guns), one for selling drugs, two for criminal acts and one for dangerous acts. Three high school students were expelled for assault, three for weapons, eleven for fighting, five for prohibited groups/gangs, two for theft, one for arson, and 34 for drug/alcohol offenses, for a total of 59.

## Expulsions During 2003-2004

A total of 153 elementary, middle school and high school students were expelled by the School Board for various reasons during the 2003-2004 school year. This compares to 152 students in 2002-2003 and 134 expulsions during the 2001-2002 school year. One elementary student was expelled during the 2003-2004 school year, compared to none in 2002-2003, and one in 2001-2002.

### **Causality**

During the 2003-2004 school year, two recommendations for expulsion from middle school were not brought forward to the School Board due to a finding of causality by the IEP team. This compares to nine students in 2002-2003, and five students in 2001-2002. The incidents and causality are reflected below:

### Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow; these are shown for fourth quarter and for the entire school year. Fourth quarter information by school and category for elementary schools is shown on Attachments A and B; elementary cumulative information is shown on Attachments C and D; middle school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments E and F; middle school cumulative information is shown on Attachments G and H; high school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments I and J; and high school cumulative information is shown on Attachments K and L.

## Elementary Schools

Suspensions during the fourth quarter of the 2003-2004 school year decreased to 375 from 420 during the fourth quarter of 2002-2003. There were seven weapons incidents in 2003-2004 compared to eight weapons incidents in 2002-2003.

Drug and alcohol suspensions for the fourth quarter decreased to two compared to four in 2002-2003. Seven police contacts were made during the fourth quarter in elementary schools; there were seven during the same time period last year.

## Middle Schools

The suspension rate for the fourth quarter of the 2003-2004 school year for grade 6 (Mirror Lake only), 7, and 8 is 916 suspensions, an increase from 886 in 2002-2003. Categories showing decreases are fighting/assault (184 to 168), drugs/alcohol (31 to 19). Increases are noted in harassment/bullying (49 to 56), weapons other than firearms (9 to 13) and willful disobedience (67 to 90).

Major areas included in the number of suspensions in the "Other" category are profanity/obscenity (79) dangerous actions or materials of (75), refused option to suspension (13) and general disruptive behavior (65).

## **High Schools**

There were 645 high school suspensions for fourth quarter of the 2003-2004 school year, compared to the 717 students suspended during fourth quarter of 2002-2003; continuing the downward trend in fourth quarter suspensions over the last three years.

"Other" includes infractions such as profanity/obscenity (70); general disruptive behavior (61); dangerous actions/materials (17); theft/robbery (25); truancy (30); failure to identify self (8); false witness/lying (21); vandalism/fire (8); excessive tardies (18); suspension until parent conference (8); and refused option to suspension (82).

Additional categories included under "Other" are accessory to an act (1); attempt (1); disruptive items (6); forgery (2); gambling (3); inappropriate sexual behavior (4); misuse of internet (8); reckless and unsafe behavior (17); trespass (1); disruptive behavior/disobedience (2); and that category on the VAX that lists other offenses not listed under the above options. There were four infractions under this "Other" category. There have been no comparisons reported in these categories in past years.

For the 2003-2004 school year, the total number of suspensions decreased by a total of 306 compared to last year. The largest decrease in suspensions was in the category of fighting/threats; incidents in this area are down by 243. Tobacco/smoking incidents decreased by 48, and drug/alcohol suspensions decreased for the third year in a row.

Incidents appearing in the "Other" category include: profanity (269); truancy (93); excessive tardies (44); theft (67); vandalism (18); false alarm/bomb threat (4); dangerous actions or materials (80); general disruptive behavior; (287); refused option to suspension (521); failure to identify self (29); suspension until parent conference (23); false witness/lying (100); accessory to an act (4); arson/fire (6); attempt (7); bus misconduct (25); criminal act (8); disruptive items (10); forgery/false impersonation (27); fireworks/explosives (6); gambling (5); inappropriate sexual behavior (11); misuse of internet, e-mail (9); prohibited organization/group (13); reckless and unsafe behavior (39); trespass (13); disruptive behavior/disobedience (7); and "other" (11).

**Charter Schools**

Aquarian Charter School had two suspensions during the fourth quarter of 2003-2004; one for weapons (small knives) and one for dangerous materials (lighter in pocket). They had a total of four suspensions and no expulsions for the 2003-2004 school year.

Family Partnership Charter School had no suspensions or expulsions during fourth quarter of 2003-2004. They had a total of one suspension and three expulsions (one for gang-related behavior, one for a firearm, and one for assault/weapon/criminal acts) for the 2003-2004 school year.

Frontier Charter School had no suspensions or expulsions during the 2003-2004 school year.

Village Charter School had 20 suspensions and no expulsions during the fourth quarter of 2003-2004. Fourteen students were suspended for violent actions, three for sexual harassment, two for threats and one for theft. They had a total of 29 suspensions and no expulsions during the 2003-2004 school year.

Highland Tech Charter School had 27 suspensions (listed below) and no expulsions during the fourth quarter of 2003-2004. They had 126 suspensions and six expulsions (two for firearms, three for drug/alcohol offenses, and one for theft) during the 2003-2004 school year.
