SUBJECT: FIRST QUARTER SUSPENSION/EXPULSION
REPORT - 2004-2005

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. The information is shown in the narrative information below and as Attachments A-F.

First Quarter Expulsion

Twenty-five students, including 10 middle school students and 15 high school students, were expelled by the School Board during the first quarter of the 2004-2005 school year; no elementary students were expelled. This compares to fifteen students expelled during the first quarter of 2003-2004. Five of the middle school students were expelled for drug/alcohol violations. Other expulsions were for criminal acts (2), threats (1), arson (1) and weapons (brass knuckles -1). Nine high school expulsions were drug/alcohol violations. Other students were expelled for vandalism (3), assault (2) and criminal acts (1).

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle, and high school discipline summaries follow: elementary first quarter by school and category (Attachment A & B); middle school first quarter by school and category (Attachment C & D); and high school first quarter by school and category (Attachment E & F).

Elementary Schools

The elementary schools first quarter suspension report for the 2004-2005 school year is attached for your information. Also attached is a chart comparing suspensions by category and by repeaters for the last three years. Suspensions involving weapons and

drugs and alcohol, as well as suspensions that deal with fighting/assault, sexual harassment and or harassment/bullying are compared in this narrative for the 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 school years. There were no expulsions or findings of causality for the first quarter of the 2004-2005 school year.

As compared to the 2003-2004 school year, elementary suspensions increased during the first quarter of the 2004-2005. There were 116 recorded suspensions in 2003-2004 and 164 in 2004-2005. There were five weapons violations (sharp stick, 2 small knives, and capguns) that resulted in suspension during the first quarter; there were six reported weapons incidents during the first quarter of 2003-2004.

There were zero drug and alcohol suspensions for the first quarter compared to one during the first quarter last year. There have been two sexual harassment suspensions this year, as there were last year. The largest areas of increases were seen in fighting which increased by 18 suspensions, disruptive behavior which increased by 10, assault which increased by nine suspensions and threats which increased by five.

Thirty percent of elementary schools (18) had zero suspensions both in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005. Seventeen percent of schools (10) had one to three suspensions in both 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, twenty-three percent of schools (14) increased suspensions over the first quarter of last year by one to two and the same number of schools increased suspensions by three or more. Eighteen percent of schools (11) had a decrease in the number of suspensions compared to the first quarter of last year.

Middle Schools

The number of students suspended for the first quarter of the 2004-2005 school year for grade six, (Mirror Lake only), seven and eight is 445. There were 400 suspensions during first quarter in 2003-2004. This is an increase of 45 suspensions compared to the same period in 2003-2004.

The category of fighting/assault shows the largest increase of suspensions, from 85 last year to 139 (131 fights and eight assaults) in 2004-2005. The drug category also increased from 13 to 23. Other suspension categories remained relatively the same or decreased. Of the 445 students, 65 are repeaters.

The Administration believes one cause for the increase in suspensions is that students are more aware of inappropriate aggressive behavior and are reporting more often. The schools are taking steps to be proactive in stopping aggressive and bullying behaviors, both by establishing and enforcing an appropriate disciplinary process, and by implementing violence prevention and anti-bullying programs within the school, such as the Aggressors, Victims and Bystanders Program. The SRO officers, although not housed at the middle schools, assist when possible.

Polaris K-12

Polaris K-12 had 18 suspensions during the first quarter of 2004-2005; five for disruptive behavior, one for alcohol, two for sexual harassment, one for misuse of the Internet, and one for fighting. Polaris K-12 had no expulsions for the first quarter of 2004-2005.

High Schools

The number of high school suspensions for the first quarter of the 2004-2005 school year is 755, an increase of 156 suspensions, as compared to the first quarter of last year when there were 599 suspensions.

There were 38 fighting incidents during the first quarter of the 2003-2004 school year and 104 fighting incidents the first quarter of 2004-2005 for an increase of 76 suspensions for fighting. There were 28 incidents of threats during the first quarter of this year compared to 19 during the first quarter of 2003-2004.

For the first quarter of the 2003-2004 school year there were 102 suspensions for drugs and 13 alcohol-related suspensions compared to 107 drug-related suspensions in the first quarter of 2004-2005 and 24 alcohol related suspensions. The total numbers of suspensions shown below in parentheses are now being broken out and listed separately.

Repeat offenses would not necessarily be in the same category. A student who has been suspended on a first drug/alcohol violation, for instance, may later be suspended for a different infraction and be listed as a repeater. For first quarter there were 96 first-time repeaters, 12 second-time repeaters, one third-time repeater, and one fourth-time repeater.

Charter Schools

There were 16 suspensions at Highland Tech High during the first quarter of the 2004-2005 school year (Attachment G). There were no expulsions.

Village Charter School suspended seven elementary students and two middle school students during first quarter 2004-2005 (Attachment H). There were no expulsions.

Aquarian Charter School had one three-day suspension for threats during the first quarter of 2004-2005.

There were no suspensions or expulsions at Frontier or Family Partnership Charter Schools during the first quarter of 2004-2005.
