SUBJECT: THIRD QUARTER SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION
REPORT - 2004-2005

PERTINENT FACTS:

Each quarter information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools. This information is shown in the narrative below and also as Attachments A-F.

Elementary suspensions during third quarter of the 2004-2005 school year remained the same as third quarter of last school year (384). There were nine weapons violations that resulted in suspension during the third quarter of 2004-2005 (six small knives, two toy guns and one pair of scissors), compared to four reported weapons incidents during the third quarter of 2003-2004.

Middle schools showed a significant decrease in overall suspensions during third quarter this year, from 984 last year to 726 this year. There were no firearm incidents this year compared to three in third quarter last year. Other weapons incidents increased from six in third quarter 2003-2004 to eight during the same time period in 2004-2005.

The number of high school suspensions for the third quarter of the 2004-2005 school year is 779. This represents a decrease of 12 suspensions as compared to the 791 suspensions in the third quarter. There was one firearm incident during third quarter this year, compared to none last year, but other weapons incidents decreased from nine during third quarter last year to three this year.

Third Quarter Expulsions

Eight middle school students and 32 high school students were expelled by the School Board during the third quarter of the 2004-2005. During the third quarter of 2003-2004, there were 13 students expelled from the Anchorage School District.

Expulsions for middle school students were for the following reasons: drugs/alcohol (4), weapons (1 knife), fighting/assault (1), threats to staff (1) and vandalism (1). High school students were expelled for drugs/alcohol (17), vandalism (6), fighting (4), assault (2), threats (1), weapons (1) and firearms (1).

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow. These show elementary third quarter by school and category (Attachments A & B); middle schools third quarter by school and category (Attachments C & D); high school third quarter by school and category (Attachments E & F).

Elementary Schools

There were three drug and alcohol suspensions for the third quarter compared to twenty during the third quarter last year. There were eight sexual harassment suspensions this year compared to seven last year. The largest areas of decrease were seen in fighting, which decreased by 18 suspensions and reckless behavior, which decreased by thirteen. Compared to last year, assault decreased by four suspensions, while threats increased by eight.

Twelve elementary schools had zero suspensions in the third quarter of both 2003/2004 and 2004/2005, while eight schools had one to three suspensions. Ten schools increased suspensions over the third quarter of last year by one to two, and 17 schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-five schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions from the third quarter of last year, while at eight schools the number of suspensions remained the same.

Middle Schools

The suspension rate for the third quarter of the 2004-2005 school year for grade six (Mirror Lake only), seven and eight is 726. There were 984 suspensions during the same period in 2003-2004 and 840 in 2002-2003. There were increases in fighting of 15, and drugs/alcohol of eight. Of note are decreases in the following categories: 46 in harassment, 67 in disobedience and 32 in general disruptive behavior.

This year middle schools delivered the 12 lesson Aggressors, Victims and Bystanders Program to all seventh grade students. Middle school teachers and administrators put forth substantial effort and energy with this program and to address the issues of bullying through a comprehensive change in school climate.

**Third Quarter Expulsion/Suspension Report
Polaris K-12 School**

Suspensions

There were eight suspensions for the third quarter at Polaris K-12 School for the 2004-2005 school year. This represents an increase of seven suspensions compared to the same quarter last year. Three suspensions were for drugs/alcohol, one suspension for threats, one for weapons (knife), one for theft, and two for general disruptive behavior.

There were no expulsions from Polaris K-12 School for the third quarter of 2004-2005.

High Schools

During the third quarter of 2004-2005, fighting incidents in high schools decreased by 17 compared to the third quarter of the 2003-2004 school year (from 79 to 62). Third quarter drug suspensions decreased by 16 compared to third quarter of 2003-2004 (from 92 to 76) and alcohol incidents decreased by 13 (from 30 to 17).

Charter Schools

There were no suspensions or expulsions during third quarter 2004-2005 at Aquarian, Frontier, or Family Partnership charter schools.

Highland Tech had seven suspensions during third quarter 2004-2005, compared to 32 during third quarter last year. Three suspensions were for fighting, and one each for vandalism, willful disobedience, harassment/bullying and threats. There were no expulsions, compared to four during the same time last year.
