Graduation: Board Goal Initiative

Decrease the percentage of secondary students receiving Fs for semester grades.


Decrease the percentage of secondary students receiving Fs for semester grades (quarters 2 and 4) by 5 percentage points from the previous year using end-of-year data.

Decrease the number of Fs by 5 percentage points for student groups most at risk for failure: Alaska Native, Black, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, and Students with Disabilities from the previous year using end-of-year data.

By the end of the first quarter, each secondary school will develop and submit a School Improvement Plan (SIP) to address the needs of students most at risk for failure.

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Attendance: Board Goal Initiative

Increase student attendance.


Increase student attendance (semester reporting) by 5 percentage points from the previous year using end-of-year data.

Increase student attendance (semester reporting) by 5 percentage points for student groups: Alaska Native, Black, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, and Students with Disabilities from the previous year using end-of-year data.


Each school develops a plan to address student attendance by the end of first quarter.
