

We are very excited and pleased to be working with you and your child. Our primary goals as Katmai Team teachers are to foster the development of responsibility, organizational skills, and study habits in all of our students.

As partners in your child's education, we value your support as we work together to make this year productive and successful.

TEAMING means teachers work together to plan assignments and schedule tests and projects so the workload will be spread out during the week. ZANGLE The Anchorage School District uses Zangle for keeping parents informed about student progress. We rely on parents to check Zangle regularly so that there are no end of quarter surprises as your child adapts to middle school. Please make sure you know your and your child's Zangle password to get access to this information. We update our grades on a regular basis, but our first priority is preparing, teaching and assessing lessons, so please be aware that there is a time lag between receiving work, grading and posting grades.

Student Decorum

All students are expected to listen and participate respectfully in class.

OUR CLASSROOM POLICY IS AS FOLLOWS:

1st Offense: Verbal Warning

2nd Offense: Time out, conference with student 3rd Offense: School Detention, parent notified

4th Offense Referral to Office

Substitute teachers are guests in the classroom. Students are expected to treat them with utmost respect. **ANY MENTION OF MISBEHAVIOR IN THE SUBSTITUTE'S NOTES WILL RESULT IN A MININIMUM OF 2 DETENTIONS.**

Depending on the nature of the offense, teachers may skip to a more severe consequence. Severe disruption or non-compliant behavior will result in security/office being called and student will be escorted out of classroom.

The handbook is online. Please review this handbook with your child. Students are expected to know and follow these policies.

Gruening Middle School excused absence homework policy

Illness:

If your child is going to be out <u>sick</u> for several days, please contact the attendance office to excuse them. If you would like to request work for your child, please send a group email to their teachers. We would greatly appreciate being given at least a 24-hour period from the time of your contact, so that we can adequately assemble any needed materials for your child. Please be advised that not all assignments can be sent home, and may need to be completed upon your child's return to school.

Prearranged absence:

If your child is going to be out for a **prearranged absence** please contact the office 3-5 days before you leave. We may be able to give your child work for while they are gone. However, many assignments require being in class for instruction and some may not be able to be completed if students miss class. When students are absent it is their responsibility to find out what they missed.

Makeup work:

Students with illness, pre-acknowledged, or activity absences may make-up work. One day of make-up privilege will be granted for each day of absence, plus one day, regardless of length of absence. If notification of a test was given before the absence, the students will be expected to take the test the day he/she returns to school. If an assignment was due the day of the absence, it is the student's responsibility to turn the assignment in the day the student returns to school.

Attendance is vital for success in 7^{th} grade, so be there or be a quadrilateral with 4 congruent sides and 4 congruent angles!

Late work

Becoming a responsible citizen involves learning to meet deadlines. Some teachers and parents allow children with late assignments to submit late work at the child's convenience. Typically, a generous mix of nagging, pleading, bribing and prodding is included in this process. What follows is a pattern, enabling a student to participate in a Push-Resist Cycle.

By accepting, evaluating, and recording scores for late work, teachers and parents become willing participants in an endless cycle. Late work creates little more than a backlog of paperwork and does little to reinforce good work habits in a student. Children learn to rely on adult pressure to perform vs. weathering the natural consequences of their behavior. This is not good for their self-esteem, nor does it prepare them for the world they must face when they reach adulthood.

Students will get <u>two</u> late work passes per quarter for each subject for when "life happens." These late passes allow the student to turn in a regular class assignment no more than two weeks after the due date. These passes are not acceptable for projects, tests, or long-term assignments. Katmai teachers will review the late policy on a quarterly basis and will notify the students of any changes. Please see your teacher if there are extenuating circumstances that caused you to be unable to complete an assignment and you are out of late passes.

Passes

Each student will be allowed two hall passes per quarter per class that may be used to leave the room when necessary. Gruening's policy is "no passes the first and last 10 minutes of each class".

Notebook organization

Students will need to bring their binders and writing supplies to each core class. You will need a designated section for each of your core subjects and electives with plenty of loose-leaf paper. There should be no loose papers in your notebook. Your teachers will give you further instruction as to what is expected for each class.

Paper heading

Student's full name, class and period, and date must be in the upper right corner on all papers. All teachers have a place for "no-name" papers and a way for students to claim them for credit.

Homework and Planner

The Katmai team expects an average of 1-1 ½ hours per day spent on homework or study (prealgebra students should expect a little more). This includes time spent on self-paced, long-term projects for language arts, social studies, and science, as well as daily assignments in math and other subjects. Teachers will make every effort to coordinate assignments to ensure an even load throughout the week but there may be times when this is not possible. Students should write their assignments in their planner each period, every day. Be sure to write the day work is due and any special materials that are needed. If there is no homework, that should be noted. Students are responsible for bringing home all materials necessary to complete their assignments. Having a reliable friend to call in case you forget something is useful, too.

• Blue passes

These are required for students who need to leave school during the day for a doctor's appointment, etc. Blue pass requests must be made to the office. Teachers cannot release students from class unless they have a Blue Pass. We know it is hard to get after-school appointments but it is much less disruptive for your child if they do not miss class.

Katmai 7th Grade Team Supply List

These will be used throughout the year and are required supplies for students on all 7th grade teams.

- ➤ 3-ring binder with divider tabs (1)
- Zippered Binder Pouch with the following:
 - Pencils, many (#2 or mechanical)
 - Pens, 8 12, black or blue (NO gel pens)
 - Red pens, 4-6
 - Colored pencils
 - Colored markers
 - Highlighters (at least 2)
 - Protractor
 - Sharpener, small, hand-held, with cover
 - Scissors, small, rounded point
 - Glue sticks, 4-6

- Composition book (3)
 (no spirals) (for Math, LA & Science)
- College-ruled binder paper (buy extra to keep in your locker)
- Clear plastic Report Cover with 3-prong butterfly tabs (1 for LA)
- ➤ Graph paper, ½" grid (hole punched preferred)
- ➤ Basic Scientific Calculator (recommended: TI30X)
- Ruler, metric & standard (hole punched for binder is best)
- ➤ 1 Book Cover, <u>must be extra</u> <u>large</u> (paper bag ones are fine) for Math
- ➤ 2 Boxes of tissues (give to 1^{sr} period teacher)

- ➤ 1 pkg. disinfecting wipes & 1 roll paper towels (give to Science teacher)
- Donations of any classroom supplies are greatly appreciated by the teachers.

- Pencils
- Pens
- Lined paper
- Glue sticks
