



Nevada, the leading producer of gold, is the driest state in the United States. Las Vegas, a famous gambling city, is in Nevada. Also in this state is Hoover Dam, one of the world's highest dams.

Idaho, the home of famous potatoes, has 22 different mountain ranges. Craters of the Moon National Monument can be found in Idaho. It has 80 square miles of formations that look like the moon.

Colorado's capital is Denver, the "Mile High City." A famous mountain in this state is Pike's Peak. Also in Colorado is the Royal Gorge, a 1,000-foot deep canyon. This canyon is crossed by the world's highest suspension bridge.

Arizona is famous for its warm, dry, sunny weather. Thousands go to this state to see the world's largest canyon, the Grand Canyon. Other scenic areas of this state are the Painted Desert and the Petrified Forest.
