


**Arkansas** is famous for the springs of water which bubble throughout the state. Some contain minerals which can help cure illness and some are hot. The people living in the Ozark Mountains are known for their folk arts and crafts.

**Texas** is the second largest state. A famous historical battle took place at the Alamo. Davy Crockett died in this battle. Texas leads the nation in oil, sheep, and cattle production.

**Oklahoma** is the state shaped like a pan. The western piece of Oklahoma is called "The Panhandle." Tulsa is the oil capital of the world. The headquarters of more than 800 oil companies are located here.

Louisiana is where the famous city of New Orleans is located. Each year before Lent, a carnival called Mardi Gras is held there. Jazz also had its start in New Orleans. Cotton, rice, and sugar cane are raised in Louisiana.

Birmingham. Alabama, is famous for its large steel industry. It is called "The Pittsburgh of the South" Mobile is the state's only seaport. You can go surf fishing on the Gulf of Mexico when visiting Alabama.

Mississippi has many Southern plantations that tourists like to visit. There are also sandy beaches along the Gulf of Mexico. Cotton is this state's most important crop.

**Tennessee** is the home of Lookout Mountain. On a clear day, you can see seven states from the top of this mountain. The Grand Ole Opry is located in Nashville, the home of country music. Tourists visit the Great Smoky Mountain National Park.

**Kentucky** is home to more than 250 horse farms. Lexington is the horse center of America. The U.S. gold reserves are stored at Fort Knox. Mammoth Cave is also located in this state.
